

TURNPIKE-Roads,

That the Tolls arising and to be collected at the several Toll Gates, a Side Barr, or Chain erected across a certain Highway, called Hockerhole-Lane, will be Let by AUCTION, to the best Bidder, at the House of Mrs. Martha France, Inkeeper, in Mirfield, on Wednesday the Thirteenth Day of December next, between the Hours of Two and First in the Afternoon, in the Manner directed by an Act of Parliament, passed in the Thirteenth Year of his present Majesty's Reign, for regulating the Turnpike-Roads, which Tolls produced the last Year, the clear Rent, or Sum of Six Hundred and Thirty-two Pounds above the Expences of collecting them, and will be put up at such Sum as the Trustees then present shall think proper.

Whoever happens to be the best Bidder, must at the same Time give Security with sufficient Sureties to the Satisfaction of the Trustees then present, for the Payment of the Rent agreed for, and at such Times as they shall direct.
