

## BURROW'S BANKRUPTCY

**W**HEREAS a Commission of Bankrupt is awarded and issued forth against ISRAEL BURROWS, now or late of Ledger Mills, in Mirfield, in the County of York, Corn Merchant, Corn Miller, Dealer and Chapman; and he being declared a Bankrupt, is hereby required to surrender himself to the Commissioners in the said Commission named, or the major Part of them, on the Ninth and Tenth Days of November next, and on the Eighth Day of December also next, at Eleven o'Clock in the Forenoon on each of the said Days, at the House of John Greaves, known by the Name of the Hotel, in Leeds, in the said County of York, and make a full Discovery and Disclosure of his Estate and Effects; when and where the Creditors are to come prepared to prove their Debts, and at the Second Sitting to chuse Assignees, and at the last Sitting the said Bankrupt is required to finish his Examination, and the Creditors are to assent to, or dissent from, the Allowance of his Certificate.

All Persons indebted to the said Bankrupt, or that have any of his Effects, are not to pay or deliver the same but to whom the Commissioners shall appoint; but give Notice to Messrs. Exley, Stocker and Dawson, of Furnival's Inn, London, or Mr. Scott, Solicitor, Leeds.
