

INTENDED TURNPIKE-ROAD.

NOTICE is hereby given, that Application will be made to Parliament, in the next Session of Parliament, for Leave to bring in a Bill for making & maintaining a Turnpike-Road, to commence at the Toll-Gate on the Halifax & Huddersfield Turnpike-Road, near Elland-Bridge, in the Parish of Halifax, and to extend from thence in an Easterly Direction through and over the several Townships of Elland, otherwise Elland-cum-Greeland, Southowram, Brighouse, otherwise Hipperholme-cum-Brighouse, in the Parish of Halifax, in the County of York, and through and over the Township of Clifton, otherwise Hartshead-cum-Clifton, in the Parish of Dewsbury, in the same County, to join the Dewsbury and Elland Turnpike-Road at or near a certain Obelisk in the said last-mentioned Township, belonging to Sir George Armytage, Baronet, and for diverting an ancient Horse and Foot-Way there, leading from a certain Lodge belonging to the said Sir George Armytage, to the said Obelisk, into the said intended Turnpike-Road; and which said Road will pass, or is intended to pass, as aforesaid, through the said several Parishes of Halifax and Dewsbury, in the West-Riding of the County of York, or through some Part or Parts of the same Parishes respectively.—Dated this Twenty-Sixth Day of August, 1814.
