After the Prize-Ringing at Mirfield, they received the Information that you had repeatedly practised upon Mirfield Bells, a few Days previous to the 14th Inst. this you have, therefore, either to disprove, or to prove it to be fair and equitable, before the Public will be convinced that the first Prize was "honourably won."

The Ringers of Wath expect each Party to find their own Censurer (without limiting his Residence) and an Umpire to be chosen agreeable to both.

If this Offer be accepted they will meet you at Dar-
ton on Monday, the 12th of October, to deposit the
Money and make proper Arrangements.
