

DEWSBURY AND EALAND TURNPIKE ROAD.—NOTICE is hereby given, that the Trustees acting under and by Virtue of an Act passed in the Sixth Year of the Reign of his late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for repairing, maintaining, and improving the "Road from Dawsbury to Ealand, in the West-Riding of the "County of York," will meet at the House of Joseph Armitage Rhodes, the BLACK BULL INN, in MIRFIELD, in the said County, on *Thursday, the Third Day of December next*, at One o'Clock in the Afternoon, in order to consult, determine, and agree as to the Erection of the several Toll-Gates, Side Bars, and Chains upon and across the said Turnpike-Road hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, a Toll-Gate or Chain upon and across the said Turnpike-Road, at or near a Place called Fold Head, in the Township of Mirfield, in the said County of York, together with a Side Bar upon the said Turnpike-Road, near Fold Head aforesaid, and across a certain Highway there called, or commonly known by the Name of New Gate, leading to the Hamlet of Hopton, in the said Township of Mirfield; and a Toll-Gate or Chain upon and across the said Turnpike-Road, at or near a Place called West Mills, in the said Township of Mirfield, together with a Side Bar upon the said Turnpike-Road, near West Mills aforesaid, and across a certain Highway there called, or commonly known, by the Name of Coppin Hall Lane, leading from the new Diversion of the said Turnpike-Road by Battye Ford to the old Line of the said Turnpike-Road, near Lower Row, in Mirfield aforesaid; and also for ordering Tolls to be taken at such Toll-Gates, Bars, or Chains respectively, pursuant to the Laws now in force for regulating Turnpike-Roads.
