

DEWSBURY AND EALAND TURNPIKE ROAD.—Notice is hereby given, that the Tolls arising at the several Toll-Gates, Side-Bars, and Chains, set up and being upon the said Turnpike Road, will be LET BY AUCTION to the best Bidder, at the House of Mr. Joseph Armitage Rhodes, at the BLACK BULL INN, in MIRFIELD, in the County of York, on *Thursday, the Twenty-ninth Day of October next*, between the Hours of Two and Three in the Afternoon, in the Manner directed by an Act passed in the Third Year of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth, "For regulating Turnpike Roads," which Tolls produced the last Year the Sum of £650, above the Expenses of collecting the same, and will be put up at that Sum.

Whoever happens to be the best Bidder, must, at the same Time, pay One Month's Rent in advance (if required), and give Security, with sufficient Sureties, to the satisfaction of the Trustees of the said Road, for Payment of the Residue Money Monthly, in advance.

A Deposit of £20 will be required from each Person intending to become a Bidder, previously to any Bidding by such Person being accepted; and he will also be required to deliver to the Trustees, at the same Time, the names and descriptions of his proposed Sureties.
