

## MIRFIELD.

OPENING OF THE NEW WESLEYAN DAY SCHOOL, MIRFIELD.—The Day-school, for children of both sexes, in connexion with the Wesleyan Methodist Society in Mirfield, was opened on Monday morning last. In the evening there was a public tea, the trays being furnished gratuitously by the ladies. Notwithstanding the very unfavourable weather, rain or snow falling incessantly, from three to four hundred friends assembled and took tea together. After the repast, John Nussey, Esq., of Batley (who has distinguished himself in the erection of the flourishing schools in that village), was called to the chair, and appropriate addresses, on popular education were delivered to an attentive audience, by the Revs. T. B. Goodwin and T. Vasey, and by Mr. T. H. Simpson (Queen's scholar and certificated teacher from the Wesleyan Training College, Westminster), who is appointed to conduct the school. The expense of the external improvements, internal fittings, books, maps, &c., will amount to £120, towards defraying which £55 was raised by subscriptions, collections, and the proceeds of the tea.
