

## MIRFIELD.

**SUICIDE AT MIRFIELD.**—An inquest was held on Friday evening, the 23rd inst., before T. Taylor, Esq., coroner, at the Robin Hood Inn, Mirfield, on the body of Thomas Armytage, aged seventy-five years, who committed self-destruction by cutting his throat. Deceased had formerly been a grocer, but for the last twenty years had lived on his own property at Mirfield. For about five weeks past he appears to have been depressed in his spirits, owing to an assignment of some of his property, made in 1853, the deeds of which he gave up on the 17th of January this year. He afterwards stated that there was no chance for him but to go to the bastile, and seemed much depressed. About seven o'clock on Tuesday evening he went to the privy, where he was found with his throat cut. He was removed into the house, and attended to by a medical gentleman, but gradually got weaker until Saturday, on which day he expired. Verdict, "Temporary insanity."
