

**SELLING EMBEZZLED MATERIALS.**—On Thursday last, John Wilson, of Mirfield, weaver, was brought before J. B. Greenwood and F. H. Cook, Esqrs., charged by Mr. Jesse Yewdall, the inspector, with selling purloined woollen materials, and also with having in his possession a quantity of woollen materials which had been embezzled. It was proved that, on the 22nd of April, Wilson sold to a person of the name of Haley about twenty pounds weight of cops, worth £2. Haley met Wilson at Liversedge and there received them, and paid twelve shillings for them. These materials having come into the possession of Mr. Yewdall, they were shown to Mr. J. H. Wheatley, of Mirfield, for whom Wilson worked, and he identified them as his property. On the 15th of May, Yewdall searched the prisoner's house, and there found from 40 to 50 lbs. of materials, which he could not account for. For the first offence he was committed for three months with hard labour, and for the second fined £20, or one month's imprisonment.
