

SINGULAR COINCIDENCE.—INQUESTS UPON TWO INDIVIDUALS OF THE SAME NAME.—On Friday last, T. Taylor, Esq., coroner for the honor of Pontefract, held an inquest on the body of Mr. William Mann, master carrier, of Thornhill, who had committed suicide on the previous day, by cutting his throat while in a state of temporary insanity; and on Saturday, the same coroner held an inquest at Mirfield, on another person, also named William Mann, a maltster's labourer, of that place, who was found drowned in the river near there, between two and three o'clock on Friday afternoon, and within a mile and a half of the scene of the other catastrophe. In the latter case a verdict of "Accidentally drowned" was returned. The two parties were not related to each other.
