Suicide.—Verdict of Felo de se.—()n Wednesday evening, Thomas Taylor, E-q., held an inquest at the Dusty Miller Inn, on the body of Elizabeth Watson, aged nineteen years, daughter of a waterman at Mirfield. The deceased worked at Low Mills, in Mirfield, and a Monday evening a person named Dyson was seen having improper connection with her. This involved her mind in great trouble, so much so that she put an end to her self by drowning in the river Calder the same evening. Dysou was at the inquest, and was told by the Coroner that though not legally, yet morally he was the murderer of the girl. The jury returned a verdict of "Felo de se." The Coroner issued his warrant of interment, and the deceased was buried at half-past eleven in the evening, at the parish church. Mirfield.
