INQUESTS BEFORE MR. TAYLOR.—On Tuesday, Mr. T. Taylor held an inques fat the King's Head Inn, Mirfield, on view of the body of Hiram Sheard, aged twenty-seven, who had resided at Greenside, Mirfield. On Monday, at noon, the deceased went into his garden apparently quite well. He was observed to stagger as is camo up the garden, and shortly after he was found with his face at the bottom of a trough (in which there was about five inches in depth of rain water) quite dead. The verdict was that he had been accidentally drowned. On the same day Mr. Taylor held an inquest at the Cock and Bottle Inn, Sandal, near Wakefield, on view of the body of William Ibbeson. The decensed was an infant, agod eighteen months, and the son of William Ibbeson, boat carpenter, of Cock and Bottle-lane. The child, on the preceding Saturday, had upset a mug containing hot water, and it was so scalded that it died on Monday. The verdict was that it had been accidentally scalded.
