

SHOP ROBBERY AT MIRFIELD.—Information has been received at the Dewsbury county police station, that £150 in gold and silver, seven or eight pieces of black glace silk (each piece eighty yards in length, some 26 in. and others 22 in. wide), seven or eight dozen pairs of black kid gloves, forty yards of black alpaca, and twenty or thirty rolls of various coloured ribands, were stolen from Mr. William Newsome's drapery establishment, at Newtown, Mirfield, between one o'clock in the afternoon and nine o'clock in the evening of Sunday last. Mr. Newsome, it is stated, left the premises properly secured about noon on the above day, but when he returned in the evening he found the house in disorder, and on a search being made the money and articles above-named were missed, and it was found that an entrance had been effected by taking out a cellar window. The drapery goods were, of course, stored on the shelves, but the money was kept in the bed room. The police are actively engaged endeavouring to find out the perpetrators, and a reward has been offered for such information as will lead to their apprehension, and the recovery of the property.
