OPENING OF A PRIMITIVE METHODIST CHAPEL AND SCHOOL AT MIRFIELD.—On Monday night, a public meeting was hold in the new Primitive Methodist Chapol, Nablane, Battye-ford, Mirfield, to celebrate its opening. Mr. Jas. Preston, of Bradley Hall, presided, and was supported by the Revs. T. Dearlove and R. Brook (Huddersfield), S. B. Reynolds (Dewsbury), J. Gibson, and J. Dawson. proceedings were prefaced by a tea party, which took place in the school below. The addresses delivered by the speakers were highly evangelical in their character, and apparently much appreciated by the audience. The new erection is built of stone, and has circular-headed windows and doors. and bold mouldings. The frieze, cornices, and plinth are of cleansed Ryecroft stone, with pediment and inscription. "Primitive Methodist Chapel, 1863," set thereon. The premises comprise a school-room on the basement, about thirty-three feet square inside measurement, with a boilerhouse and two class-rooms on the same floor. Above all is the chapel, which is neatly fitted up. It will accommodate nearly 300 persons. It may be stated that the formal opening took place on Sunday, and that Capt. McCullooh, of York, and the Rev. Jas. Dawson, of Pocklington, preached the sermons.
