

HOUSE BREAKING AT RAVENSTHORPE.—On Monday, at Dewsbury Police-court, Edwin Walmesley, a tramp, who said he came from Liverpool, was charged with breaking into the house of George Dyson, Mirfield-lane, and stealing therefrom. It appeared from the statement of the wife of Mr. Dyson, that on Friday afternoon she left her house about one o'clock, locking the door after her, but leaving the back kitchen window open. On her return to the house in a few minutes she saw the prisoner standing on the stairs with a bundle under his arm. She ran into the street, raised an alarm, and the prisoner leaped from the window of the bed room, and ran down Mirfield-lane. He was pursued and captured. Nothing was found on his person, but he was observed in his flight to throw away a pair of stockings which he took from his pockets and which were afterwards found in a garden adjoining the road. The prisoner admitted the charge, but said he should not have done it if he had not been hard up. He was sent for trial at the sessions.
