ROBBING A BLIND MAN.—At the Dewsbury Police-court, yesterday, before Mr. J. B. Greenwood, Dan Wormald, of Mirfield, was charged with stealing a quantity of boot-laces, the property of a blind man named Pinder. On Saturday evening the prosecutor was at Mirfield hawking boot-laces, and amongst other places he called at a public-house where the prisoner was seated. The laces were handed about the company, and Wormald took the opportunity of pocketing the whole and walking off with them, of course unperceived by the prosecutor, who stayed a short time expecting that the people were making their choice. The matter came to the ears of the police, and they apprehended the prisoner, and found the laces in the pocket of a coat he had worn the previous evening. Before the discovery he denied the charge. The bench committed him to prison for two months.
