

DEWSBURY TOWN COUNCIL.—A meeting of this body took place yesterday, Mr. Ald. Rawsthorne presiding, in the absence of the Mayor. A deputation from Ravensthorpe, on the subject of abolishing the toll bars on the Dewsbury and Elland turnpike road, was received, and it was resolved to give the deputation what aid they could. Three members of the Council were appointed to wait on the commissioners of the trust at their next meeting; together with a number of gentlemen from Ravensthorpe. The minutes of the various committees were read, and amongst others was one acknowledging a communication from Halifax, asking if the Dewsbury Town Council were willing to join that Corporation, and those of Bradford, Wakefield, and Huddersfield, in meeting the expense of a stipendiary magistrate to act for a district to include those boroughs. The Committee (General Purposes) to whom the communication was sent, reported that they had replied that as the grant of a Commission of the Peace for the borough of Dewsbury had just been made, they would prefer to wait to see how it worked before sanctioning such a scheme. A new borough rate and a watch rate were sanctioned.
