MIRFIELD AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY.

The annual exhibition of this society took place on Saturday afternoon, and was attended by a large and fashionable company. The show-ground was a field at Eastthorpe, admirably adapted to the purpose, and it was laid out very well. The chief attraction was the show of fruit, flowers, and vegetables exhibited in two classesgentlemen's gardeners, and cottagers. Of fuchsias, liliums, geraniums, fine foliage plants and ferns there was a very good collection. The show of out flowers was hardly up to the average of previous exhibitions by this society, The same remark applies to fruit. The horse and cattle classes contained some fine animals, those well known breeders, Mesars. Crawshaw and Blakeley, of Dewsbury, taking first honours. Of pigs there was a fair average show. A good deal of interest appeared to be taken in the leaping trials by horses and ponies, especially in those which included a water-jump. An attempt at fraud by an exhibitor, Jesse Livesey, of Lepton, near Huddersfield, caused much comment. He had sent a quantity of wheat, barley, and cats to compete in the agricultural class. The produce was according to the conditions all in the straw, but when the judges came to examine it closely they found that fine ears' of wheat and also of barley and oats. had been fitted into long and healthy straw. Livesey was of course disqualified, and his produce ticketed that he was struck out because of imposition.
