NEW CHAPEL AT MIRFIELD .- Yesterday afternoon the corner-stone of a new chapel for the Baptists of Minfield (to supersede the old one in which they have until lately worshipped, and which had become too small for their requirements) was laid in the presence of a large number of spectators by Mr. Josiah Berry, of Lockwood, near Huddersfield. A procession was formed of minieters, Sunday school teachers and scholars, at the Mirfield Town Hall, and proceeded to the site of the proposed edifice. After devotional exercises; Mr. Henry Walker, of Sands Field House, Mirfield, presented a silver trowel to Mr. Berry, and Mr. Cocking, of Huddersfield, the architect, presented him with a mallet, both suitably inscribed. Mr. Berry then proceeded to lay the stone with the usual formalities, after which the Rev. J. P. Chown, of Bradford, delivered a brief address. The new structure, which is to be erected from designs by Mr. Cocking, architect, of Huddersfield, will accommodate 630 persons. The style of architecture is Romanesque, and the cost will be about £3,000.
