

A LEADS EXCURSIONIST'S ADVENTURES AT MIRFIELD.—On Friday, at the Court-house, Dewsbury, Chas. Arthur Wilson, a young man from Leeds, was placed in the dock charged with being drunk and riotous at Mirfield Railway station, and with assaulting a porter and a ticket collector. The prisoner left Leeds by train on Thursday, intending to go to Manchester races, and when the engine drew up at the platform of Mirfield station he got out of the carriage in which he was seated, and attempted to enter one of a superior class, but was detected and made to quit. This led to an altercation, but seeing the train moving away, he tried to enter one of the carriages, but was prevented doing so by the officials. Enraged at this, he struck the porter and ticket collector, and was thereupon given into custody. The magistrates ordered the prisoner to pay 7s. for being drunk and riotous, or to be imprisoned for ten days, and fined him 40s. and costs for the assaults, with the alternative of two months' additional imprisonment in the House of Correction.
