LANCASHIRE AND YORKSHIRE BAILWAY. -- Mr. DIGBY SEVMOUR, Q.C., and Mr. SHAW were for the Plaintiff; Mr. FIELD, Q.O., and Mr. MELLOE for the Defendants. -The plaintiff is a joiner near Minfield, and sought to recover damages for the loss of his son through the negligence of the company's servants in failing to close the gates of a crossing called the Dark-lane Crossing, and Mirfield. situated between Heckmondwike The s teamster, and when crossing deceased was the with line of waggons, 24th8 team the OD March, 1872, he was knocked down by the engine of a passing train, and received injuries from the effects of which he died. The deceased was carning 16s. a weak at the time of the acoident. - The jury returned a Verdict for the Plaintiff; damages \$210.
