

PRIZE FIGHT NEAR DEWSBURY.—Yesterday morning one of those brutal exhibitions known as a prize fight came off at a place called Hunger Hill, situated about three-and-a-half miles from Dewsbury, and about four-and-a-half from Huddersfield. The spot is a very retired one, and is on the borders of Mirfield and Whitley Lower. The combatants were Patrick Kelly, of Huddersfield, a gravedigger, and J. Kelly, of Dewsbury, labourer, and so well had they and their respective partisans kept the meeting a secret, that the police knew nothing of it until the battle had been lost and won. John Kelly was the victor, his opponent being severely punished. He was conveyed away by his backers. Up to last evening neither of the men had been apprehended. This is the second time they have fought.
