DEWSBURY.

At the Magistrates' Court, yesterday, Wm. Clegg, blacksmith, Bradford, and John Crossland, tobacconist, Huddersfield, were charged with being drunk at Mirfield Railway Station, and the latter was further proceeded against for assaulting a police-sergeant named Marshall. The prisoners, it appeared, had been drinking at Huddersfield. They were going to Leeds, but broke their journey at Mirsteld, and went into the village, where they had some more liquor. After this they returned to the railway station, and Clegg walked between the metals, though an advancing train was near at hand. He was dragged on to the platform, where both he and the other prisoner became so violent that they were given into custody. At the lock-up Crossland made a furious attack on the sergeant, and both struck and kicked him. Clegg was fined 10s. and costs, or fourteen days, and Orossland 20s. and costs, or one month. Mr. Ridgway appeared on behalf of the railway company.
