

FUNERAL OF MR. J. B. GREENWOOD.—The remains of the late Mr. Greenwood were consigned to their last resting-place in the Mirfield Parish Churchyard yesterday morning, in the presence of a large number of people. The funeral procession started from the residence of the deceased at eleven o'clock. There were over fifty members of the West Riding Constabulary lining the approaches to the church. The procession was met at the church by the magistrates of the Dewsbury division; the Rev. J. P. Foster, Vicar of Mirfield; and the Rev. St. George Kerr, Vicar of Staincliffe.
