

MIRFIELD LIBERAL CLUB AND THE GOVERNMENT.—On Saturday the annual tea and meeting in connection with this club took place at the Town Hall, Mirfield. There was a large attendance. Mr. John Wamsley presided over the meeting. On the motion of Ald. Glendinning, Huddersfield, seconded by Mr. T. C. Taylor, Batley, the following resolution was carried:—“That this meeting expresses its full confidence in Her Majesty’s Government, and trusts that the Cabinet will stand by their Reform Bill in its integrity, and afterwards pass a Redistribution of Seats Bill, based upon equitable representation; and that this meeting expresses its conviction that it is the duty of all Liberals to sink individual crotchets and heartily support Mr. Gladstone and the Ministry.”—Mr. Wilson, Mirfield, moved, and Mr. C. Burley, Heckmondwike, seconded, “That this meeting desires to express its confidence in the policy pursued by Her Majesty’s Government in Egypt and the Sudan, and to protest against the unfair and unreasonableness of Her Majesty’s Opposition in Parliament as a course of procedure unusual and unstatesmanlike.”—The resolution was carried.—It was also resolved, on the motion of Mr. J. E. Walker, Mirfield, “That this meeting declares its conviction that any interference with the lawful choice of a constituency is calculated to subvert the rights of the whole body of the electors of the United Kingdom.”
