FATAL ACCIDENT AT A COLLIERY NEAR DEWS-BURY .- On Saturday evening Major Taylor, district coroner, held an inquest at the Ravenswharf Inn, near Dowsbury, to inquire into the circumstances attending the death of Joseph Netherwood, colliery labourer, of Mirfield, who was killed on the previous day by falling down a shaft at Ravens Lodge Colliery, belonging to Messra. G. and J. Haigh. Mr. Gerrard, Inspector of Mines, was present at the inquest. The evidence showed that deceased had descended the shaft, which is only used for pumping water out of the workings, and after assisting to change some buckets, he was being drawn up the shart in a cage, when, by some means or other, after having ascended about 40 vards, he fell out, alighting at the bottom of the shaft, and was instantly killed. It was thought he had overbalanced himselt. The jury returned a verd of "Accidental death."
