DEWSBURY.

Yesterday, at the Dewsbury West Riding Police-court, Herbert Calcutt, a young man living at Raveusthorpe, was ordered to pay 30s. and costs or suffer a montu's imprisonment, for wiltully damaging growing wheat at Northorpe, Mirsield, the property of Mr. Joseph Lister, farmer. Defendant was seen to take four children into the field and to walk eighty yards across the standing corn, and then go for a hundred yards down the side of the enclosure. The damage done amounted to 10s. The Bench expressed their regret that they could not order him to be whipped, and the Chairman (Mr. W. Carr) said that in his experience as a magistrate this was the worst case of trespass that had come before him.
