

RAVENSTHORPE v. MIRFIELD.—These teams met at Ravensthorpe on Saturday before a large attendance of spectators. Both teams played their full strength, and a splendid exciting game was witnessed, which ended in a draw, neither side scoring a major point. Dennis, the Mirfield captain, started the play. The return was muddled, and the first scrimmage was formed in the home half. Chatterton got the ball away, and for some time the game was contested near the centre.
