CAB-DRIVERS AND THEIR FARES.-Yesterday, at the Dewsbury West Riding Court, a Mirfield cabdriver, named George Lister, was summoned for refusing to convey a person to her destination within the Mirfield Urban Sanitary District.-The defendant said he had a bond fide engagement, and if it had only been a journey of some ten minutes he would have taken the girl, but he could not have been back in time.-Mr. E. T. Ingham, Justice of the Peace, said he was the person who had engaged the defendant for ten o'clock, and he was of opinion that on such a night it would have taken him threequarters of an hour to go to Hopton Hall and back .---The Bench dismissed the case, but told defendant that cab-drivers could not pick and choose fares.
