

RAID UPON GAMBLERS AT MIRFIELD.

On Thursday, at Mirfield, the West Riding police raided the Navigation Inn, and, under the Act for the suppression of gambling, took into custody Mrs. Naylor, the landlady; John Mack, betting man, on whom £70 3s. was found; Henry Sheard, George Ellis, Frederick Swithenbank, Absalom Spink, Harry Loader, Richard Lister, Higsworth Holdroyd, Terry Naylor, all of Mirfield; Benjamin Crowther, Heckinondwike; Edwin Lister, Brighouse; and Joseph Broadhead, of Ravens-thorpe. They were taken before Mr. J. E. Walker, at the Mirfield Police-station, and remanded to the 21st inst. at Dewsbury. The police, who had acted under the directions of Superintendent Midgley, of Dewsbury, were led in the raid by Inspectors Gregg and Morley.
