

THE RAILWAY ACCIDENT AT MIRFIELD.

Mr. T. Taylor held an inquest on Saturday last on the body of the driver and stoker of the goods train killed near Mirfield railway station under circumstances already detailed. The inquiry was held at the Black Bull Hotel, Mirfield. There attended on behalf of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company Mr. Parmeter (solicitor), Mr. T. Normington and Mr. Leech; on that of the London and North-Western Railway Company, Mr. J. L. White and Mr. Job Tardy. Mr. White expressed the regret of his directors at the death of the two men, and said anything they could do towards clearing up the matter they willingly would do. The deceased were William Glover (28), of Lamb-street, Longsight, locomotive driver, and James Wright (20), stoker, of Whirley-road, Macclesfield. After full inquiry, the jury returned a verdict of "Accidental death," and recommended that the loop line be altered. The Coroner said that no doubt the companies would attend to the matter.
